THE PARISH COUNCIL SUPPORTS LOCAL ORGANISATIONS

At a meeting of the Finance and General Purposes Committee held on 5th March 2008, Cranleigh Parish Council considered a number of applications for grants and/or donations.

Cranleigh Arts Centre. The Arts Centre has been relying on temporary repairs and inadequate heating sources since its two central heating boilers failed during the winter. The Trustees of the Arts Centre are seeking funding from a number of agencies in order to reach their target of £12,375 to replace the boilers and the Parish Council is delighted to be able to support Cranleigh Arts Centre by a grant of £2,000 towards this target. The Arts Centre is used by a large number of Cranleigh residents who will benefit from the contribution made by Cranleigh Parish Council which is delighted to be supporting an organisation which makes such a significant contribution to improving the quality of life of the people of Cranleigh and its surrounding district.

Glebelands School. In the school year 2008/9, Glebelands School will be celebrating the 50th Anniversary of its opening. A grant of £500 was awarded to the school to support their celebrations. This grant will be used towards the planting of fifty trees around Cranleigh in the grounds of local schools and community locations as a tangible recognition of the fifty years and to demonstrate the growth in the future of our young people. The planting of trees is also representative of the ecological commitment of the school. The Parish Council welcomed the opportunity to support the grant application and recognised the excellent work undertaken by the school and its young people.

Royal British Legion. A grant of £200 to the Royal British Legion, Cranleigh and District Branch, was agreed towards the costs of the Remembrance Day parade and service.

Surrey Air Ambulance Fund. A donation of £100 was agreed towards the excellent work of the air ambulance and a grant for £300 towards necessary medical equipment.

Cranleigh Parish Council sets aside a small fund for grants principally towards capital funded projects which give a tangible and immediate benefit to the community. Funds are limited and individual awards exceed £500 only in exceptional circumstances.

Donations will be made towards the cost of schemes and projects in the local area which the Council deems worthy of support. Applications can be made for donations up to £100 and these are not restricted to capital items.

John Bainbridge, Chairman of the Finance and General purposes Committee, said "Wherever we are able The Parish Council seeks to support deserving local organisations that are of benefit to the whole community. We have to operate within a strictly limited budget and are very pleased to have been able to assist each of these beneficiaries in this way and wish them continued success."

SNOXHALL PLAY PARK – CAN YOU HELP?

The Parish Council is working hard to secure funding for Snoxhall Play Park and already has £50,000 from the Big Lottery Fund towards the £125,000 project.

The Parish Council is working with the Youth Centre to apply for another £9,000 from Awards For All, however, additional funding would bring the project to realization more quickly.

The Parish Council would like to hear from you if you have time to help with fundraising or if you would like to make a donation to the project.

Snoxhall Play Park will be a facility for all of the community. It will provide an area to sit and enjoy the surroundings at Snoxhall as well as a place for families to take their children to play and for young people to meet. If you cannot spare any time or cash, but would like to write a letter of support, this would be helpful to the project.
