Parish Council news

In the 1960's Bob Dylan sang that 'times - they are a changin' and this is very true for Parish Councils at the moment. With the financial cuts taking their toll on the principal authorities, and the Government's 'Big Society' agenda, Parish Councils are being asked to take on more responsibilities for services on behalf of their communities than ever before.

Cranleigh Parish Council has always been very proactive in trying to ensure that its residents get good services and it has been said that the 'Big Society' is alive and well in Cranleigh and has been for many years already.

We recently re-accredited our Quality Status which is a benchmark to state that we work efficiently and effectively with our community. Quality Status is held by only a few councils in Surrey. The Council had to complete a portfolio demonstrating that we work proactively with our community, that Councillors had undertaken training and that the Clerk was suitably qualified. Re-accreditation is every four years.



In July the Parish Council took direct responsibility for employing the Cranleigh Co-ordinator post, held by Emma Dawson. Emma organises the annual Christmas Light Switch on event in Cranleigh and other events during the year such as Spring into Cranleigh. There are several events organised for over the Christmas period including a Santa Dash and carol singing in Stocklund Square. The next big event will be Spring into Cranleigh and the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. If anyone has any ideas for the Jubilee please contact us and let us know, similarly if anyone wishes to volunteer to help with any of the events we would be delighted to hear from you.

We are still talking to Waverley Borough Council with a view to taking responsibility for the Public Conveniences in Cranleigh.. There are still some loose ends to tie up but hopefully, once some refurbishment work has been completed, the keys will be handed over to the Parish Council.

Surrey County Council has announced that their Youth services in Cranleigh are subject to a review and the Parish Council has been actively supporting maintaining the existing excellent service provided by our Youth Worker, Nicci Millar Foy.

And finally,

our Village Hall Caretaker retires on 30th November after 21 years of service to the community. Peter has provided an excellent service to the users of the Hall. Everyone wishes Peter a long and happy retirement.

Cranleigh is well on its way to applying to become a **FAIR TRADE COMMUNITY**.

A recent survey has shown that 126 people out of 130 questioned had heard of Fair Trade and only 6 did not buy some fairly traded goods. This is greatly helped by the fact that the supermarkets represented in the village stock a variety of fairly traded goods - from tea and coffee to bananas and wine. It is easy to buy and use fairly traded produce by looking for the FAIR TRADE logo on products.

We all know that Cranleigh is a village that respects its inhabitants – gaining Fair Trade status would illustrate that we respect those overseas who supply our tea, coffee, fruit and many other goods.



What is FAIRTRADE?

Fairtrade is a collection of suppliers, growers from countries all over the world who, with help, have attained a quality and quantity of their goods and products to meet stringent health, quality and ethical standards. They are paid a 'proper' amount for their high quality produce and are thus able to improve their living conditions, education and health, learn new skills, improve production and start to produce new crops.

Fairtrade status for Cranleigh entails certain criteria that we, as a village, have to attain, sustain and promote to enable the village to become accredited.

The application to become a Fair Trade Village is already supported by schools, churches and the Parish Council. The Parish Council supports encouraging local retailers to provide Fairtrade options for residents and local businesses to offer Fairtrade options to their staff.

Can YOU HELP us?

Please continue to buy and support Fair Trade goods when you shop.

If you use fairly traded goods in your business, let the steering group know so that this can be included in our application.

If you would be prepared to pledge to use fairly traded products in any form e.g. offer FAIR TRADE refreshments to your staff and/ or customers please let the steering group know – MORE BUSINESSES ARE NEEDED TO SIGN UP.

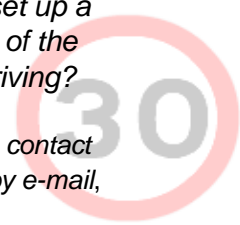
Surrey Police Mobile Front Counter Service
