Neighbourhood Plan for Cranleigh

The Parish Council was delighted that there was so much interest shown in a Neighbourhood Plan for Cranleigh at the launch on Monday 13th January, but very much regretted that its popularity meant that some people were not able to get into the Village Hall to hear what Mr C Bowden of Navigus Planning Ltd had to say. A repeat meeting was quickly organised for 27th January at Glebelands School when hopefully those who weren't able to attend on 13th January had the opportunity to come along.

From the 600 people who attended the meetings in January, over 100 people put their names forward to progress the Neighbourhood Plan, and they were invited to meetings on 10th March, so that they could learn more and so they could sign up to be in Working Groups. Those in attendance identified six significant areas of importance, housing, transport, communication and infrastructure, heritage and design, economy and environment.

On 31st March another meeting was held at the Village Hall and the Working Groups met properly for the first time. Those present appointed Michelle Morgan as the Leader of Cranleigh Neighbourhood Plan. She and the appointed Leaders of the Working Groups will form the Steering Group. Meetings of the Steering Group will be open to the public and the next one is scheduled for Monday 28th April at 7pm in the Parish Council Offices.

The Waverley Community Partnership 2014/15 scheme awarded £1,000 to the Parish Council towards the Youth Café. The Café opens during term time between 3.15p.m. and 5.45p.m. every Tuesday, Thursday and Friday evenings at the Youth Centre on Snoxhall Fields. On payment of 60 pence per session, there is a hot snack and drink, opportunities to meet and relax with friends, take part in activities such as games, art, craft and music and have the chance to talk to qualified youth workers.

Defibrillators

Organisations representing Cranleigh and Ewhurst have been working together over the last few months to secure life saving Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) which will be sited within the communities for use in an emergency.

The League of Friends of Cranleigh Hospital has generously funded six Automatic External Defibrillators, five of which will be situated in the Public Houses in Cranleigh; one will be installed at the Village Stores in Ewhurst,

In Cranleigh, the Public Houses that have signed up to the scheme are the Cranley Hotel, The Richard Onslow, The Three Horseshoes, The White Hart and The Little Park Hatch. Public Houses were chosen to host the AEDs as they are central points within the community and are open relatively long hours, so that the public can gain access to the AED for the maximum amount of time. The involvement of the publicans has been welcomed and in time, it is hoped that they, and all of the staff who work on these premises, will be trained to use the equipment.

However, all residents in each of the communities of Cranleigh and Ewhurst are being encouraged to learn how to use an AED and to take part in free drop in training sessions at the St John HQ at Little Mead Estate, Cranleigh every Wednesday from 7pm to 9pm throughout April. If the sessions prove popular, they could be extended throughout the year with the aim of teaching as many people as possible in Cranleigh and Ewhurst cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and demonstrating how easy it is use a defibrillator.

Spending a few minutes training could make the difference between a life lost and a life saved.

The AEDs will be the responsibility of the Parish Council. Dianne Davies handed over the defibrillators to the Parish Council on 18th March and Councillors handed over the equipment to the publicans in a short

ceremony on 7th April at St John Ambulance in Cranleigh. St John Ambulance has been actively involved throughout the process, advising on the equipment, encouraging everyone associated with the project to undertake training and offering help to the Parish Council in checking the AEDs on a regular basis. The AED community scheme is supported by SECAMB. The Parish Council held a training session on Thursday 10th April in the Village Hall at 7pm to add their support to the project.
