Large Planning Applications which affect Cranleigh

The first of several large planning applications which relate to development in Cranleigh arrived at the Parish Council Office a couple of weeks ago and in response, the Planning Committee arranged to hold an Extraordinary Planning Meeting in the Village Hall on Monday 30th June at 7pm to consider Planning Application WA/2014/0912 – Land South of the High Street between Alfold Road and Knowle Lane, so that those who wished to attend the debate could do so. Members of the press and public were welcome to attend and there was an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions at the beginning of the meeting. This is the case at all Council Meetings.

Whilst the Parish Council is consulted on Planning Applications in the Parish we are not the Planning Authority, neither are we statutory consultees, so although the Parish Council gives a local view, residents who wish to make comments about a particular application are urged to make representations to Waverley Borough Council as well as the Parish Council. All details of the applications, and the views which have been expressed can be found on the Waverley Borough website.

If local people wish to view plans in hard copy, they can do so at the Parish Council Office by appointment. We have been concerned that there has only been a relatively short period in which to submit our views and that has been communicated back to Waverley Borough Council.

The application WA/2014/1038 for land south of Amletts Lane and north of Roberts Way will be considered at the Planning Meeting on Monday 14th July at 7pm. All agendas for meetings are displayed on the Parish Council website www.cranleighpc.org and in hard copy on the notice board at the rear of the Village Hall and on the door of the Parish Council Office.

The Richard Onslow, the Cranley Hotel, The White Hart, the Three Horseshoes and The Park Hatch.



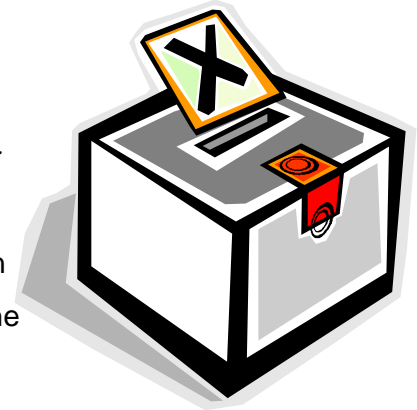

There is currently an application with the War Memorial's Trust for grant funding towards cleaning the War Memorial and it is hoped that this can be done in time for Remembrance Day this year.



Planning Infrastructure Contributions

Waverley Borough Council holds Planning Infrastructure contributions on behalf of Cranleigh. In April the Council considered a wish list of projects to be explored further. Those listed below are some of the items where further work will be undertaken and proposals put forward to release funding.

Environmental Improvement

Installation of a litter bin next to the bench outside the Guide Hall on Village Way - £500.

Litter bins and picnic benches on the Bruce McKenzie Memorial Field - £2,170.

Improvement to surfacing on the Down's Link - £6,500

Installation of a litter bin near to the bus stop near Nuthurst Avenue on Ewhurst Road - £500.

Lighting at Snoxhall Fields - £5,000

Playing Pitches

Top dressing on football pitches on Snoxhall Fields.

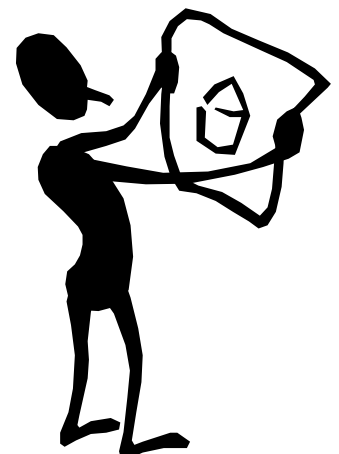
Community Facilities
